The Melton Area Safer Communities Partnership aims to respond to ASB as soon as is possible. This document outlines the timeframes that partners work to when dealing with incidents of ASB.

Animal Problems	Melton Borough Council	1 Working Day	Action is prioritised based on the nature of the report.
Begging/Vagrancy	Leicestershire Constabulary	1 Working Day	
Street Drinking	Leicestershire Constabulary	1 Working Day	
Malicious/Nuisance communications	Leicestershire Constabulary	1 Working Day	
Noise	Melton Borough Council	1 Working Day	
Prostitution related activity	Leicestershire Constabulary	1 Working Day	
Littering/Drugs paraphernalia	Melton Borough Council	1 Working Day	Issues where public safety is at risk will be dealt with immediately. Other reports will be prioritised according to information received.
Inappropriate use/sale/possession of fireworks	Leicestershire Constabulary	1 Working Day	
Hoax calls to emergency services	Leicestershire Constabulary	1 Working Day	

Graffiti	Melton Borough Council	1 Working Day	Action dependent on receiving permission. Offensive graffiti may be removed prior to this.
Neighbours	Melton Borough Council	(Serious) – 1 Working Day (Routine) – 5 Working Days	
Rowdy/Nuisance – Rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour	Melton Borough Council	1 Working Day	
Trespass	Leicestershire Constabulary	1 Working Day	
Abandoned vehicles – (Not stolen or causing an obstruction)	Melton Borough Council	1 Working Day	If a vehicle is determined to be abandoned it will be removed within 2 working days.
Vehicle nuisance – Inappropriate vehicle use	Leicestershire Constabulary	1 Working Day
