YOU ASKED...WE DID

Melton Borough Council and Shout4Residents believe it is important to communicate with the residents of South Melton. Shout4Residents meets on a regular basis to discuss local issues with Melton Borough Council, Residents, Voluntary Action Melton, the Police and Councillors. Here are the issues raised recently-

- ◆ ***You asked for facilities for young people***....we are supplying a Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) outside of The Edge Community Centre, Dalby Road. Also we are currently working with residents to provide a new play area for children
- ◆ ***You asked for the bus shelters to be removed on Queensway***.....this cannot be done as they cost a lot of money and is not financially viable. The police will continue to respond to reports of anti social behaviour working alongside Melton Borough Councils Anti Social Behaviour Officer. The bus stops are on the police way marker system where they will be monitored by police in the area when they are on down time
- ◆ ***You asked for the alleyway between Barker Crescent and Dalby Road to be cleaned***.....the alleyway has been provided with a new bin and is monitored by the local environmental champion on a regular basis
- ◆ ***You asked for the large crack in the ground outside of The Edge close to the Dalby Road bus stop to be repaired as a resident had tripped on it***.....we plan to build the MUGA in this location which will deal with this

GPs, Practice Nurse, or physiotherapists make referrals, and patients are invited along for an exercise consultation with an instructor., who will give individual advice and support to help them become more physically active.

A suitable and safe exercise programme will then be designed in accordance with the patient's abilities and needs.

Sessions are held at Waterfield Leisure Centre and The Cove Community Centre on Sysonby Street.

Cost is £2 per session and programmes last for 10-12 weeks.

NO COLD CALLING ZONES

Do you have a large number of older or vulnerable people living on our street? Or have you or one of your neighbours suffered from a distraction burglary?

If so you could be eligible for a No Cold Call Zone, to prevent people being duped by bogus callers and cold call sellers targeting vulnerable people. Arranged through Trading Standards and set up by the local police team, the street is added to a database to deter companies from targeting that area.

All residents receive a pack a, which includes leaflets on the Telephone and Mail Preference Services plus Avoiding Doorstep Crime and Dirty Dozen Cons and How to Avoid Them, a leaflet from Severn Trent to set up a password system to protect people against criminals gaining access under the premise of The Water Board. Residents will receive stickers for the door, to alert callers that they will not buy from doorstep traders.

Street signs are erected by the Highways Agency - these act deterrent to anyone who may wish to try their luck in that particular street.
